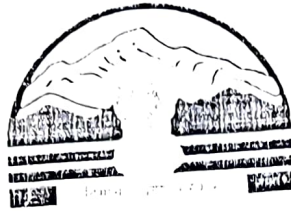

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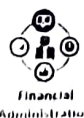

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

Devniti: Use of Deities in Local Politics

Before independence, the nature of panchayat institutions was informal in Himachal Pradesh (HP) and lacked participation of the marginalised sections, mainly women and Scheduled Castes (SCs). While regions like Malana—a village in Kullu district—these institutions were representative and played a crucial role in the sociopolitical lives of the locals. Locally, these institutions were known as *Khumbli/Khumli*. Modern panchayats were established in 1954 under the Himachal Pradesh Panchayati Raj Act, 1952. This act was amended in 1956 and then in 1968. Subsequent to the 73rd Constitutional Amendment Act, 1992, the state legislature of HP passed the new panchayati raj act in 1994.

In HP, voting turnout in the panchayat elections is always higher than the assembly and Lok Sabha elections. According to the state election commission report, the total voting percentage in the sixth panchayat elections in January 2021 was 80.4%, with 39.19 lakh people exercising their franchise, which explains the importance of these elections. The panchayat elections in the state are still far away from the influence of the state/national parties. While analysing the 2021 panchayat elections in the Chauhara block of Shimla district, the indigenous element seems electorally relevant. The role of local deities is one of them. These deities are locally known as *devatas*. They play an important role in determining the voting behaviour. This strategy is popularly known as *devniti* in the region. Simply put, *devniti* means the involvement of *devatas* in panchayat elections, which influences the voting behaviour. Local deities play a crucial role in the sociopolitical lives of the people in these societies. Sometimes, commands from these deities define their electoral preferences too. However, the name of *devatas* is used by candidates to mould the behaviour of local voters in their favour. At the same time, it is a multidimensional practice determined by various aspects. One important aspect which was observed during the author's field visit was

development. In the Chauhara block, most of the villages are small in size and panchayats are generally constituted by the amalgamations of two or more villages. To ensure the development of the village, everyone wishes that their preferred candidate gets elected. For the guarantee of each and every vote of the village, *devniti* is invoked for the mobilisation of votes. Also, this involvement is more likely when there is only one candidate contesting from a village.

The conducting body of *devniti* is *devata* committee. It is a privileged body which consists of *mootbeen* as the head and other members known as *kaardar*, who are elected by the locals with a common consensus. This committee organises day-to-day affairs of the *devata*, that is, visits, religious ceremonies, collection of funds and local festivals which are organised in the name of the *devata*, among others. The involvement of *devatas* in panchayat elections is more likely if any member of this committee or a person close to the committee members is in the fray.

One correspondence revealed that "these practices are used as a means by the influential people of the village to create unity by making the villagers to take a vow of the *devata* to vote for their candidate only." In other words, it is used as a mechanism by the village elites for uniting the villagers and influencing voting behaviour during panchayat elections.

On the contrary, followers of other faiths (mostly Christians) in the region do not believe in the *devatas* and avoid their gatherings and other related ceremonies. As a result, the believers of the local deity do not prefer to vote for the candidate belonging to these religious communities.

The involvement of *devatas* in panchayat elections is multifaceted. It is not the *devatas* who are directly involved in

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these elections but the people who use their names for wholly political purposes. It has also been observed that some candidates make an emotional appeal and give offerings to the devata in front of all villagers so that their win becomes a matter of the devata's wishes. For the sake of the devata's pride, people of the village vote accordingly.

While interacting with the locals, almost everyone finds a positive relation between education and rational voting behaviour. However, two different standpoints were observed while examining the significance of education in relation to the practice of devniti. First, a largely acknowledged viewpoint among the people cites their widespread illiteracy as a reason for the emergence of devniti. They further hailed the spread of education as a tool for diminishing this old practice. It is evident that young candidates with higher education criticised the involvement of the devatas in panchayat elections and raised banners against the politicisation of the gods.

The religion-politics debate is a longstanding one in Indian society. Devniti in HP is no exception to these debates. It highlights the importance of religious beliefs and its impact on electoral choices in the hill societies and finds a positive relation between rational voting behaviour and education.

Strengthening Democracy

On 2 March 2023, a five-judge bench of the Supreme Court unanimously laid down that the appointments of the Chief Election Commissioner and Election Commissioners will be done by a committee comprising the Prime Minister of India, the leader of the opposition or the leader of the largest opposition party, and the Chief Justice of India. Earlier, the practice was to make this appointment through the President on the recommendation of the Prime Minister.

India being the largest democracy in the world is placed under a constant obligation to ensure free and fair elections. In such a scenario, the independence of election-conducting authorities is of

great importance. Various incidents have happened in the past because of which questions were raised regarding the appointment of such constitutional authorities and whether their conduct was sufficiently independent of executive control or not.

To understand the need of the present verdict, the constitutional history and debates around appointments must be discussed. Article 324 in the Constitution vests the general power of appointment in the President, who acts on the aid and advice of the council of ministers. So, it was the government alone that had the power to appoint and remove election commissioners. On the contrary, Article 324 itself lays an obligation on Parliament to enact laws for such appointments. However, the constituent assembly was determined regarding the independence of the election commissioner; so, instead of providing an exact law, it empowered Parliament to lay down one, which could not have been achieved in the 73 years of India's parliamentary history.

Along with the duty of conducting free and fair elections, the election commissioner has numerous other powers, including ensuring the model code of conduct, announcing election dates, and settling in-party disputes. Few recent incidents like the rift between different factions of the Shiv Sena, deciding the election schedule for states like Gujarat, among others have put the Election Commission in the dock. Such instances undermine the very idea of independent institutions under a democracy. In its verdict, the Supreme Court noted that the union executive, which consists of the ruling party, has a direct conflicting interest in such appointments of constitutional posts.

Questions still remain: Would the paradigm shift in constitutional appointments be helpful in ensuring an effective and transparent working of the Election Commission? Is it not possible for the government to overrule the said verdict, citing it as judicial overreach? An answer to the first question regarding the effectiveness of such an appointment mechanism is that we already have a model for appointing chiefs of constitutional institutions. It is not only the appointment

but the hegemony of the ruling government, their power to manipulate the functioning of these institutions, and lucrative post-retirement benefits that make things difficult. Still, the new approach is likely to settle the dust on the role of election commissioners working for the time being. If the decision of the Supreme Court is overruled by Parliament, it is automatically going to cast a shadow of suspicion over its constitutional appointments, which would be unhealthy for any democratic country. The Supreme Court in its decision has already made it clear that the mechanism they have laid down for appointments would be there till Parliament comes with a law on this issue. Ideally, this decision is supposed to act as a guiding light for the executive instead of undermining their legislative authority.

Democracy is an ever-evolving concept, and India, being the largest and among the youngest democracies in the world, has a long path to walk on. Ensuring the independent and transparent working of constitutional bodies is inescapable. On a similar footing, one can always question the other constitutional appointments as well; for example, the appointment of Supreme Court judges is also marred with unscrupulous allegations from the government. For the efficient working of institutions, all conflicts should be weeded out in line with constitutional principles, leaving aside all political and individual prejudices. Hence, the recent ruling of the Supreme Court on appointments of the chief election commissioner and election commissioners is a leap forward in ensuring the democratic nature of Indian polity.

Report on Special Lecture on National Digital Library (NDL) by Dr. Tanu Kalsi



The session began by providing an overview of the **National Digital Library (NDL)**, emphasizing its role in facilitating access to vast academic resources for students, researchers, and professionals. She highlighted NDL's importance in bridging the digital divide and enabling learners to enhance their academic and professional pursuits through easy and free access to high-quality digital content.

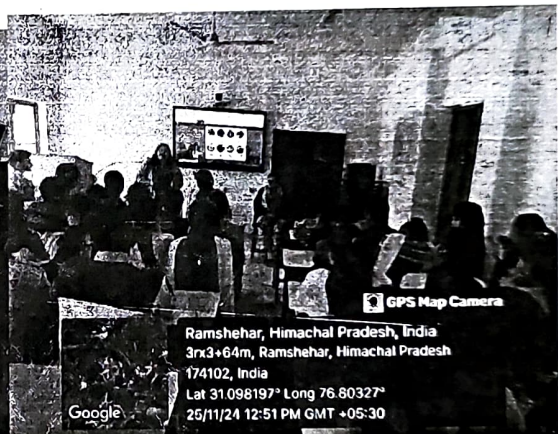
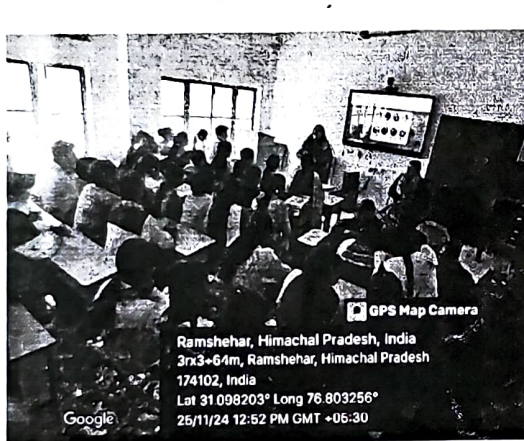
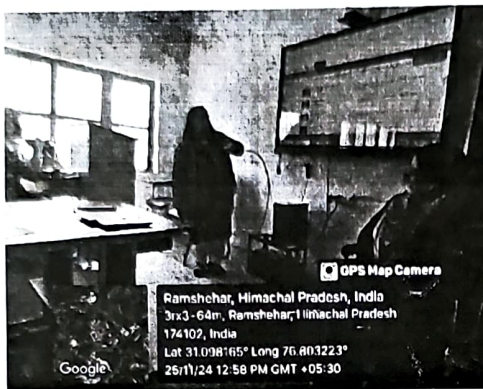
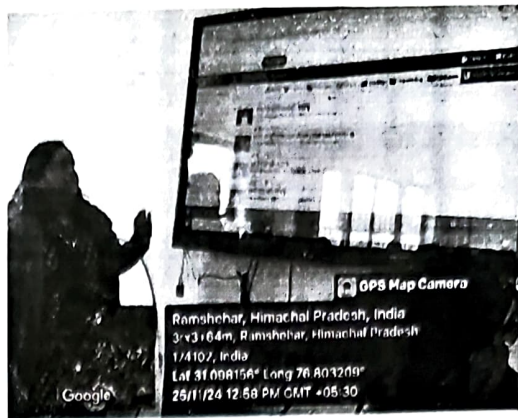
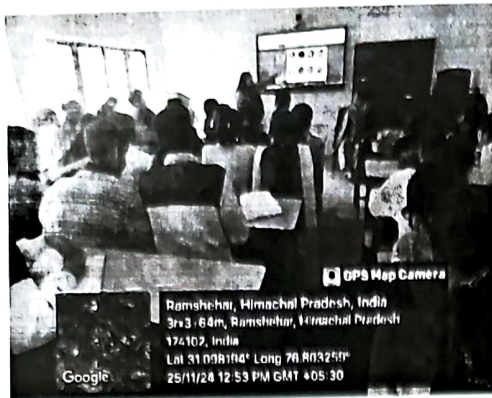
Key Highlights of the Lecture

1. **Registration Process on NDL:** She conducted a step-by-step demonstration of the registration process on the NDL platform. She explained how to create an account, set preferences for specific subject areas, and personalize the library interface. Students and attendees were encouraged to register during the session, ensuring they could access the vast repository of resources.
2. **Exploring Higher Education and Research Resources:** She elaborated on how NDL caters to the academic needs of students pursuing higher education. She demonstrated how to navigate through the collections of books, research papers, theses, and conference proceedings. She also emphasized the portal's significance for research scholars by showcasing its extensive repository of materials across diverse disciplines.
3. **Career Development Resources:** The lecture also focused on how NDL supports career development. Dr. Kalsi pointed out resources such as competitive exam preparation materials, skill enhancement content, and vocational guidance, which can be accessed through the platform.
4. **Newspaper Archives:** A noteworthy feature of the NDL was its **Newspaper Archives**. She demonstrated how students could access historical and contemporary newspapers to stay informed about current affairs and historical events, benefiting areas like journalism, history, and policy research.
5. **Integration with NMEICT, Spoken Tutorials, SWAYAM Prabha, and SWAYAM Portal**
Dr. Kalsi elaborated on the integration of NDL with initiatives such as:
 - o **NMEICT (National Mission on Education through ICT):** She explained how this mission contributes to the development of e-learning content accessible on NDL.
 - o **Spoken Tutorials:** A project designed for self-learning, providing tutorials in multiple languages for software training.
 - o **SWAYAM Prabha:** A collection of 32 high-quality educational channels that are linked with NDL, enabling learners to access recorded lectures.
 - o **SWAYAM Portal:** She discussed how students can leverage the SWAYAM portal for online courses and certifications, enhancing their skills and academic credentials.
6. **Live Demonstration of NDL Usage:** She concluded the lecture with a live demonstration of the NDL platform. Students were guided through the interface to explore its functionalities, such as keyword-based searches, topic categorization, and bookmark options. Attendees also had the opportunity to explore the portal hands-on during the session, gaining practical experience in using the library.

Over 30 students registered on the NDL platform during the session, gaining direct exposure to its utility. The lecture was highly informative and practical, leaving the attendees with a clear understanding of how to utilize the National Digital Library effectively. 44 students were present in the lecture.
